The Varga family from Timisoara, Romania is Mum, Dad and seven children, who all live in one attic room. Alex, one of the oldest is twelve years old and has cancer. After we had eaten, there was a big surprise - we were all given gifts from Ireland. Inside mine were sweets, toys, bracelets and other useful things - wow! I was so excited that there are people who care for me. It made me feel warm inside. Everyone was screaming with delight and we all went to bed with a glowing face".
